The National Institute of Development Administration (NIDA) is now accepting applications for admission to the Doctor of Philosophy Program in Human Resource and Organization Development (International Program) Scholarship Applicant (Second Round) Academic Year 2025.

1. Scholarship Applicant Qualifications

1.1 Plan 1 (1.1) Research Track (Type 1 Scholarship): Applicants must hold both a Bachelor's degree (minimum GPA of 3.00) and a Master's degree from a program involving a thesis or high-level research or demonstrate experience in research beyond classroom assignments. The Master's GPA must be at least 3.50 from a university accredited by the Commission on Higher Education. Applicants are also required to possess additional research experience through independent research or participation in projects outside of degree coursework.

1.2 Plan 1 (1.1) Research Track (Type 2 & Type 3 Scholarship): Applicants must have a Bachelor's degree (minimum GPA of 2.75) and a Master's degree from a program involving a thesis or high-level research or experience in conducting research beyond classroom assignments, with a Master's GPA of at least 3.50 from a university accredited by the Commission on Higher Education. Applicants must demonstrate research experience through independent research or participation in research projects beyond their degree coursework.

1.3 Plan 2 (2.1) Coursework Track (Type 1 Scholarship) : Applicants must have both a Bachelor's degree with a minimum GPA of 3.00 and a Master's degree with a minimum GPA of 3.50 from a university or institution accredited by the Commission on Higher Education.

1.4 Plan 2 (2.1) Coursework Track (Type 2 Scholarship) : Applicants must have both a Bachelor's degree with a minimum GPA of 2.75 and a Master's degree with a minimum GPA of 3.50 from a university or institution accredited by the Commission on Higher Education.

1.5 Plan 2 (2.1) Coursework Track (Type 3 Scholarship) : Applicants must have both a Bachelor's degree with a minimum GPA of 2.50 and a Master's degree with a minimum GPA of 3.50 from a university or institution accredited by the Commission on Higher Education.

1.6 Plan 2 (2.2) Coursework Track (Type 1, 2, and 3 Scholarship): Applicants must have a Bachelor's degree with a minimum GPA of 3.00 from a university or institution accredited by the Commission on Higher Education.

1.7 English Test Scores Requirement: All applicants (except under condition 1.8 below) must submit a test score from either the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or The International English Language Testing System (IELTS). The required minimum TOEFL score is 550 (NIDA ITP paper-based), 550 (paper-based), 213 (computer-based), or 79 (internet-based). The minimum IELTS score required is 6.5. The test score must be obtained within two years prior to the application deadline.

1.8 Alternative English Test Scores: Applicants may submit A Duolingo Test score of at least 110 or TOEFL ITP paper-based score from an institution other than NIDA, with a score of at least 550. These scores may be submitted under the condition that the applicant takes and passes at least two English courses required by the School of Language and Communication, NIDA, and submits the minimum required score of TOEFL 550 (NIDA ITP paper-based), 550 (paper-based), 213 (computer-based), 79 (internet-based), or an IELTS score of at least 6.5 before graduation.

1.9 English Test Score Exemptions: Applicants who are native English speakers or those who have earned a Bachelor's and/or Master's degree from an international academic institution where English was the medium of instruction, and who graduated within the past five years prior to the application date, are exempted from the English test score requirement.

2. Application Procedure

2.1 Application Form is available for download at <http://hrd.nida.ac.th/hrd-phd/>, and available to pick up at the School of Human Resource Development and the Educational Service Division, NIDA.

2.2 Application Submission: Application is accepted from now in person, by post, or via e-mail. The deadline for application submission as follow.

3. Required Documents for Application

3.1 A completed application form.

(Form A, available for download at <https://hrd.nida.ac.th/hrd-phd/apply.php?htmlpage=10>)

3.2 A copy of Thai Identification Card (for Thai applicants), or a copy of passport (for foreign applicants).

3.3 A copy of official transcript(s) of all universities or colleges attended.

3.4 Official English Test Scores: All Scholarship applicants, except those specified under exemption conditions, must submit an English proficiency test score from either TOEFL or IELTS, with a minimum TOEFL score of 550 (NIDA ITP paper-based or paper-based), 213 (computer-based), or 79 (internet-based), or an IELTS score of at least 6.5, obtained within two years prior to the application deadline. Alternatively, applicants may submit a Duolingo Test score of at least 110 or a TOEFL ITP score from another institution with a minimum of 550, provided they also complete and pass at least two English courses required by the School of Language and Communication, NIDA, and submit the required TOEFL or IELTS scores before graduation. Applicants who are native English speakers or have completed a Bachelor’s and/or Master’s degree from an international academic institution where English was the medium of instruction, within the past five years, are exempted from submitting an English test score.

3.5 Three (3) letters of reference (Form B, available to download at <http://hrd.nida.ac.th/hrd-phd/apply.php?htmlpage=10> from academic advisors, or profession supervisors who could justify applicant’s academic performance and/or professional work.

3.6 Two (2) 1x1 inch color photos (must taken not more than six months prior to submission).

3.7 A 3-5 page statement of purpose, written in English, should describe career goals, professional accomplishment objectives, research interests, and program goals. Please use a 12-point non-condensed font (e.g., Times New Roman) with 2.5 cm margins.

3.8 A 3-5 Page Research Proposal, written in English (Optional)

3.9 Research Publication (Optional)
